The Carbine Club of Tokyo Finishes 2025 with Melbourne Cup Glamour and Japan Cup Insights



The Carbine Club of Tokyo entered November on a high. After a fabulous golf day in April and a successful AFL Grand Final lunch and livecast in September, we were determined to finish the year even stronger, with our Melbourne Cup Luncheon and, several weeks later, our Japan Cup Preview Lunch.

James Cummings shared his racing insights ahead of his move to Hong Kong's trainer ranks.

We returned to the Grand Hyatt Tokyo's Coriander Room on 4 November. Preparations were especially glamorous this year thanks to the table-decorating flair of Dani Brown and her team, including Club member Travis. More than 140 guests attended, and the afternoon featured what was quite possibly our best Fashions

on the Field contest yet. Special guests included His Excellency Justin Hayhurst, Australia's Ambassador to Japan. Former Wallaby and Tokyo Club member Bernard Foley and his rugby mates again drew plenty of attention, posing for photos with fellow attendees.

We were also fortunate to secure outstanding prizes. Members Ian Scott and Darren Morrish landed a joint sponsorship from Qantas Airways and Hyatt Centric Melbourne, a silent-auction prize of return flights for two from Narita to Melbourne, plus two nights for two at that stylish hotel. Member Monica Taylor added another silent-auction highlight by securing a high-end skincare program donation. Treasury Wine Estates continued its long-standing support with two superb Penfolds wines.

Bidding started quietly but gathered momentum through the afternoon, helped along by our emcee, Catherine O'Donnell, a well-known Tokyo-based lawyer who has served on the board of the Australia New Zealand Chamber of Commerce and the audit and supervisory boards of several blue-ribbon Japanese corporations. Her calm, confident handling of the room kept the energy up and the bids coming.

When the bidding closed and raffle proceeds were tallied, the luncheon raised nearly ¥1.2 million (around A\$12,000) for YouMeWe, a Tokyo-based non-profit that equips 33,000 children in institutional care and another 15,000 in foster homes with essential life skills, and for the Asian University for Women Foundation Japan. Michael Clemons of YouMeWe and Ali Buford of the foundation shared their heartfelt thanks.

A special thank-you also goes to Tia Haywood of TopTia Photography, an award-winning portrait professional who has captured our events beautifully in recent years. She also put together a collection of stunning highlights from the day.

Our final event of the year was the Japan Cup Luncheon at the prestigious Pullman Tokyo Tamachi Hotel on Friday, 28 November. The 40 or so attendees included racing professionals and owners from Japan and Australia who gathered to preview Japan's most prestigious race, run the following Sunday. Honoured guest James Ross, Head of Racing Commercial at the Hong Kong Jockey Club, offered a detailed assessment of the field and shared tips on likely contenders. We were also delighted to welcome James Cummings, who shared his perspectives on the Japan Cup and the wider racing scene. James is set to join Hong Kong's trainer ranks in the 2026/27 season, and he will no doubt do one of Australian racing's most storied families proud.

As always, the luncheons benefited from the incredible efforts of Tokyo Club President Darrin Hartshorn and members like Treasurer Tim Barnstable and Sponsorship Co-Managers Frank Foley and Leon Van Houwelingen.

In closing, we send season's greetings to Carbine Club chapters around the world. We look forward to 2026, and to another year of sport, good fellowship, and enjoyable times.

Paralympics Scholarship CCSA

The Carbine Club of SA started a scholarship programme for Paralympics SA in 2024 at the suggestion of two of our Members, Grant Harrison (Vice President of Commonwealth Games Australia along with Joe Stevens OAM Commonwealth Games South Australia.

Nominations were received from athletes in the SASI Launch Pad programme which is managed by Jed Altschwager and Emily Petricola; aspiring athletes are guided through a series of tests to assess their ability in various Para sports and provide a pathway.

The Scholarship recipient for 2025 is Brooke Joppich, who, after progressing through the previous SASI Launch Pad Academy decided on wheelchair basketball as her chosen sport. Brooke also attracted attention from multiple Para-sports including rowing & cycling. Brooke's skill and commitment were recently acknowledged with an invitation to the National Under-25 Women's Pathways Camp in Canberra this December. With her growing experience and versatility across sports, Brooke's future in Para-sport is exceptionally bright.

The CCSA were invited to present the scholarship to Brooke at the presentation night for the current SASI Launch Pad programme.

Grant Harrison and Joe Stevens OAM were both on hand to present the scholarship of \$5,000 to Brooke Joppich, at this stage Brooke plans to put the funds towards the purchase of a new Sports Wheelchair which will cost \$25,000.
